Fine Line Exhibit Closes May 31 with Event Geared Toward Children

Fort Worth – Parents are invited to bring their young children to the Fort Worth Museum of Science and History for an enlightening discussion about mental health as the exhibit, “Fine Line: Mental Health/Mental Illness” draws to a close this weekend. This is the final event in a series of programs that have drawn broad interest since the exhibit opened. “We’ve had excellent turnout at the educational programs,” said Patsy Thomas, President of Mental Health Connection of Tarrant County. This exhibition was made possible through a partnership among Mental Health Connection of Tarrant County, JPS Health Network and the Fort Worth Museum of Science and History.

“The comments we have received from people engaging in the exhibit also show us the impact it has had.” The exhibit profiles individuals whose lives have been touched by mental illness with photographs and audio recordings. “This exhibit fights stigma by allowing visitors to come face to face with people who have mental health issues and hear about their dreams and hopes as well as their challenges,” said Thomas. The parent and child discussion on managing challenging behaviors is scheduled for Saturday, May 30 at 10am. The exhibit closes Sunday, May 31. Fine line is a free exhibit open to the public.
