The lecture, which is a part of the Museum's Celebrity Lecture Series, will explore the history of Camp Bowie.

Shortly after the United States joined the First World War, 30,000 troops descended on Fort Worth to train and prepare. What became known as Camp Bowie lasted only a few years, yet it left a permanent mark on our city. During the lecture, which starts at 7:00 PM, guests will discover what went on in Camp Bowie's eastern section - the land that would go on to become the Cultural District the Museum sits in today.

Guests can dive deeper into the fascinating history of Camp Bowie at a VIP reception preceding the lecture at 5:45 PM. The paid reception includes complimentary refreshments and an opportunity to chat with Tyler Alberts and Trace Chinworth.
