Disney/Pixar's *Coco* Comes to the Omni Theater This Fall
Take a Musical Journey to the Land of the Dead

Fort Worth, TX - The Fort Worth Museum of Science and History is bringing Disney/Pixar's *Coco* to the Omni Theater for select dates this October and November. The vibrant tale of family, fun and adventure will take families on a magical, music-filled journey to the Land of the Dead with a 12-year old boy named Miguel.

The film centers on the Mexican Day of the Dead holiday, *Día de los Muertos*. Miguel, an apprising young musician (voiced by newcomer Anthony Gonzalez), embarks on an extraordinary journey to the magical land of his ancestors. There, the charming trickster Hector (voiced by Gael Garcia Bernal) becomes an unexpected friend who helps Miguel uncover the mysteries behind his family's stories and traditions.

Coco premiered theatrically in the United States in November 2017. The film won two Academy Awards for Best Animated Feature and Best Original Song. It also won Best Animated Film at the BAFTA Awards, Golden Globe Awards, Critic's Choice Awards and Annie Awards.

In addition to seven English showings throughout October and November, the Omni Theater will also have a special Spanish showing of *Coco* on November 4. Learn more about *Coco* at the Omni Theater [here](#).
