



## Jerusalem Returns to the Omni Theater Tomorrow

The Omni Theater features an innovative IMAX® domed screen that fully immerses audiences in the iconic sites presented in *Jerusalem*. This viewing experience is the largest of its kind west of the Mississippi River. The eight-story tall and 120-foot wide screen transports audiences 7,000 miles away to the sacred land cherished by billions of people. The theater features 70mm film projection which combines the brightest, clearest images at almost 10 times the resolution of standard projection formats, with powerful, laser-aligned digital sound and customized theater geometry to create the world's most captivating film experience.
