Fort Worth, TX - The Fort Worth Museum of Science and History is pleased to announce a new program that will open its doors to all. The Museum has partnered with the Institute of Museum and Library Services (IMLS) and the Association of Children's Museums (ACM) to offer discounted admission to SNAP recipients and their families through *Museums for All*.

Under the <u>Museums for All</u> program, guests presenting a SNAP Electronic Benefits Transfer (EBT) card and a Texas ID may purchase up to four exhibit admissions tickets at \$3 each. Regularly priced exhibits admissions tickets are \$16 for adults and \$13 for juniors (2-18). *Museums for All* expands access to museums and also raises public awareness about how vital museums are in their communities.

"We see the excitement every day and know a great experience here can be enough to spark a lifetime interest in science and learning. Cost should not be a barrier to great learning experiences."
