## UPCOMING PROGRAM DESCRIPTIONS

### **Texas Seashore** SEPTEMBER 2019

In this program, participants will learn about some of the fascinating animals that are native to the Gulf Coast of Texas.

### **The Animals in your Neighborhood (Urban Wildlife)** OCTOBER 2019

Participants will learn about some of the most common types of urban wildlife and how they have adapted to living with us in our neighborhoods.

### **Cave Dwellers** NOVEMBER 2019

Participants will learn about animals that live cave systems and the adaptations they use to survive in low light environments.

### **Texas Symbols** DECEMBER 2019

Learn all about some of the animals, plants and minerals that have been designated by the Legislature as symbols of the great state of Texas.

### **Desert Ecosystems** JANUARY 2020

Participants will explore how animals have adapted to the harsh desert environment.

### **Fantastic Flyers** FEBRUARY 2020

Participants will explore the fantastic world of animal flight and how it looks different in birds, insects and mammals.

### **Dinosaurs** MARCH 2020

This lecture focuses on fossils, the different types of dinosaurs and some specific dinosaurs that have been found here in Texas.

### **Forest Creatures** APRIL 2020

Learn all about the amazing animals that make the forest habitat their home.



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### **Pollinators** MAY 2020

Did you know that insects are not the only animals that pollinate? Learn all about the different animals that pollinate plants and the adaptations plants have to support them with the process.



### **What's For Dinner (Predators and Prey)** JUNE 2020

Participants will discover what makes an animal either a predator or prey and how each is specialized for eating, hunting or avoiding predators.

### **Trinity River Ecosystem** JULY 2020

Participants will learn about the animals that live in and around the Trinity River as it flows through Fort Worth.

### **Endangered and Threatened Animals of Texas** AUGUST 2020

Participants will learn about animals that have the threatened or endangered label, some of these animals, their current threatened or endangered status and what is being done to help protect them.

### **Magnificent Migrators** SEPTEMBER 2020

Learn about the fascinating world of animal migration and some of the animals that undertake this amazing adventure.

### **Bird Beaks and Beyond** OCTOBER 2020

Participants will learn about how different types of birds have adapted to their environments by looking at specific types of birds and their beaks and the types of food they eat.
